**Short bio:** Nikolaos Olma is Postdoctoral Research Fellow at the Leibniz-Zentrum Moderner Orient in Berlin and lecturer at the Institute for Social and Cultural Anthropology, Martin Luther University of Halle-Wittenberg, Germany. He holds a PhD in Anthropology and Central Asian studies from the University of Copenhagen. He previously worked as Postdoctoral Research Fellow at the Max Planck Institute for Social Anthropology in Halle (Saale), Germany and taught courses in economic, urban, and environmental anthropology at Freie Universität Berlin and the University of Copenhagen. Nikolaos has extensive fieldwork experience in Central Asia and is the author of several academic articles on the region. He is currently working on a book examining how the inhabitants of a former uranium mining town in Kyrgyzstan negotiate the consequences of chronic exposure to low doses of radiation.
